God be praised for every person here this morning and for all who are with us in spirit as they watch and pray at home. God strengthen us all through his word and promise in our Lord Jesus Christ.

The coronavirus infection continues to threaten people who have not been vaccinated and some who are fully vaccinated. In our determined care for each other, please follow these rules:

- If you arrived with a cough, fever, sniffles or other symptoms of a respiratory infection, please say a quiet prayer, excuse yourself, and go home.
- All services are "mask-optional" for people who have been vaccinated. Go without one if you wish. Wear one if you wish.
- If you haven't been vaccinated, please be sure to wear a mask for your own safety and as way of caring for the people around you.
- Singing is permitted at all services, though we urge you to sing quietly.
- Continue to observe social distancing rules.
- Continue for the time being to sit only in marked pews. Use your
 judgment on how close you wish to be to people at the other end.
 Listen kindly to their concerns if they have any.
- Continue to share the Peace with a nod, a bow or a wave of the hand. No handshakes or hugs yet.
- At communion we will continue to use the pouring chalice and individual cups. The pastors will mask when they consecrate the elements and wear a glove to distribute the host.



At the announcement of the Gospel:

⁴¹Now every year his parents went to Jerusalem for the festival of the Passover. 42 And when he was twelve years old, they went up as usual for the festival. ⁴³When the festival was ended and they started to return, the boy Jesus stayed behind in Jerusalem, but his parents did not know it. 44Assuming that he was in the group of travelers, they went a day's journey. Then they started to look for him among their relatives and friends. ⁴⁵When they did not find him, they returned to Jerusalem to search for him. ⁴⁶After three days they found him in the temple, sitting among the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions. ⁴⁷And all who heard him were amazed at his understanding and his answers. ⁴⁸When his parents saw him they were astonished; and his mother said to him, "Child, why have you treated us like this? Confession of Faith




