LUTHERAN SCHOLARSHIP GRANTING ORGANIZATIONS OF OHIO

This month we are kicking off the 2023/24 appeal for donations to the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Ohio (LGSOO).

The purpose of the LGSOO is to raise scholarship dollars for students to attend Lutheran schools throughout Ohio. Donors can designate Messiah Lutheran School to receive 100% of the gift or split it between other participating schools in the group. Scholarships are prioritized for students of low-income households and are granted at the beginning of each school year.

Last year was the first time this opportunity was available to Ohio taxpayers. We would like to thank the 43 people that gave a total of \$31,875 to the 2022/23 LGSOO for the benefit of Messiah Lutheran School.
