

FROM THE PASTOR

"For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven ..." Ecclesiastes 3:1 (ESV)

Greetings & Peace,

I wish to share some of reflections from a devotion which was recently shared with our Messiah School staff during morning devotions. Did you know that our MLS staff gathers each day for morning devotions before the students arrive? At approximately 8:15 am each and every school day, you can pray for our school staff as our staff gathers to begin the day with a faithful word and shared prayer together.



This particular devotion focuses on the "slow, healing work of winter." This devotion speaks to me. And I believe it may also speak to you. Rather than reprint the entire devotion entitled: **The Slow, Healing Work of Winter** written by Jennifer Dukes Lee, I invite you to follow the link and read the devotional for yourself: https://proverbs31.org/read/devotions/full-post/2022/02/10/the-slow-healing-work-of-winter.

Here, I offer some reflections: My grandfather's name was Carl. He was, amongst other things, a farmer in Ashland County, Ohio. My cousins and me would routinely be asked to go "rock picking" on the family farm. This yearly activity involved walking in crop fields behind a hay wagon being pulled by a tractor. Our job was to pick up rocks and throw the rocks in the wagon. Why was "rock picking" necessary? So that the farm implements could do their work tilling the soil without interference. Rocks can do significant damage to the equipment. And broken or compromised farm machinery could impact productivity and the bottom line. So "rock picking" was a yearly activity. I always wondered where all the rocks came from? "Didn't we walk this field last year, Grandpa?"

It turns out the earth has a built-in system of healing. Jennifer Dukes Lee's devotion mentioned above says it like this: "You may wonder how rocks keep emerging. There isn't some "rock fairy" dropping stones onto fields to annoy farmers. Instead, stones are heaved forth in the frost/thaw cycle of the earth." The winter season has a way of healing the land.

In a similar way, the winter seasons of our lives have the capacity of offering slow, steady healing to the lives of people like you and me. Human beings need seasons of rest, seasons of healing. Or as the devotion says, "we all need winter seasons to heal us -- to unearth rock-like burdens embedded in the soil of our hearts."

A life of faithful response to the love of Christ oftentimes looks more like a crooked country road than a straight, well-paved city street. We all need seasons of winter healing and times of slowing down, so that God can go to work in our lives. We need to rest, reflect, and allow God to go to work "picking rocks" in our hearts. God frees us for the next season of our lives and a continuation of this journey of faith.

As we prepare our hearts and minds for the coming Lenten season, may you experience an unburdening and renewed perspective in Christ

A Prayer to Pray: Dear God, part of me resists the slow, healing work of winter. But I know that there are rocks in the field of my heart, and You are the One who can roll them away. Please come "pick rock" in my heart right now, showing me the hard places I may not even be aware of, and till the soil so that You can grow something new and beautiful in me. Thank You that You are with me for every step of my healing. In Jesus' Name, Amen.

LAUNDRY LOVE GENEROSITY

A "MITE-Y" EXAMPLE OF GENEROSITY

In the Gospel of Mark, the story of the Widow's Mites describes a widow who gives two small copper coins, mites, to the temple treasury. Two mites together were worth the smallest Roman coin, the smallest and least valuable in Judea–worth about six minutes of an average daily wage.

Jesus witnesses this offering and describes how great the woman's gift is because it represents a greater proportion of her wealth than the larger gifts of other religious leaders. Calling his disciples, Jesus said to them, "This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

Last year Laundry Love had a "Mite-y" example of generosity with a gift in support of our outreach ministry to our monthly guests at Leo's Laundromat. Over the last few years, our Care Team got to know Chandra (Shaun), age 45, very well. Everyone knew that she loved the heavy-metal band Metallica and dragons! She was outspoken and fiercely independent, taking her wheelchair on the bus, hauling it up, then down those three steps—all while carrying her laundry to Leo's and back to her apartment. Her mom called the church to let us know that Chandra passed away when her transplanted kidney of 13 years failed this past June. In conversation, her mom said that Laundry Love was the social event Chandra looked forward to every month, especially the free community meal. She also informed me that Chandra had left all she had to Laundry Love—her checking account balance of \$167.67. That amount plus another \$50 in memorials given in Chandra's name, provided funds for two community meals—including Giant Eagle fried chicken (her favorite!) at Thanksgiving.

While Mark's parable of the Mites gives us no indication of the widow's demeanor or frame of mind, she gave more than the rich; because she gave ALL she had. Another school of thought is that Jesus was condemning the social system that rendered the widow poor. In Ohio, a "living wage" for a single adult with no children is \$15.33. Minimum wage is \$10.10. Poverty wage is \$6.53/hour. This is the situation for the majority of the people whom we've met through Laundry Love.

Our Messiah Epiphany "Star Words" brings memories of Chandra to mind. Her name comes from Sanskrit, "She outshines the stars". Chandra was diagnosed with functional autism at age 23. She attended college and had lived independently since high school graduation. Life was often challenging for Chandra, but she tackled it head-on, and our Laundry Love Care Team was there to make a difference. Here's to our upcoming 8th year of Love. Dignity. Detergent. Let's help MORE people in Jesus' name! Who's with us?!

ORGANIZATION OF OHIO Donation Deadline Extended

Good news! It is not too late to contribute to the LSGO for 2023. Recent leg-

islation passed that allows a taxpayer to make the contribution up until the date you file your Ohio Tax return or the return due date.

If you have not already contributed for 2023 and have not yet filed your Ohio taxes, please consider doing so. Donation limits are \$750 for individuals and \$1,500 for married couples filing jointly.

You may also begin making contributions to the 2024 campaign—either in a lump sum or spread into periodic contributions between now and April 15, 2025. On behalf of Messiah Lutheran School, we wish to thank all the donors who supported the Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Ohio (LSGOO). Throughout 2023, 42 donors designated Messiah Lutheran School for their contributions. These donations help make private Lutheran education a reality for more students and families.

The LSGOO purpose is to raise scholarship dollars for students to attend Lutheran schools throughout Ohio. The LSGOO makes it possible for Ohioans to contribute funds to be allocated to Messiah Lutheran School. Donors to the LSGOO qualify to receive a non-refundable tax credit for their donation, which will be applied to their Ohio income tax liability, dollar-for-dollar, up to \$750 (or \$1,500 if married filing jointly, where each person separately donates \$750 or more).
