* A remembrance of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem on the Sunday before his crucifixion.

* St. Matthew's Passion, the recount of Jesus' last supper, his prayer and agony in the garden, then his arrest, trial, crucifixion, and burial.

GOOD FRIDAY Friday, March 29

- * **Noon:** We hear St. John's account of Jesus' Passion and pray for the church and the world.
- * 8:30 pm: Messiah's Tenebrae service. The word means "darkness." Lights begin to dim and go out as we listen to key episodes of the passion story. At the end the only light to be seen surrounds the cross where Jesus hangs. Consider inviting your friends, family, coworkers & neighbors to this 8:30 pm Tenebrae service on Good Friday.

MAUNDY THURSDAY Thursday, March 28; Noon & 7 pm

Worship: 7 pm

"A new commandment I give you, that you love one another." In the old Latin Bible, "commandment" is *mandatum*. That's where "Maundy" comes from. This is a day for remembering Jesus' last supper with his disciples, when he washed their feet and gave them the splendid meal the church continues to share. The morning service is primarily for Messiah School.

Greetings & blessings during this Lenten season –

The other day, I was out and

about driving around from here

to there. As I was driving, I was

also listening to one of my "go

to" channels on Sirus XM. A

song I have always loved finished up, and a new song which I have never enjoyed began to play. They are similar songs. Each with relatively similar instrumentation. What was the difference? The tone of the singer's voice.

Has it ever occurred to you how important voice (and the "tone of voice") is? It makes or breaks a date, a water-cooler conversation with a colleague (do water-cooler conversations with colleague's even still exist?), and the ways we might respond to just about any spoken word.

For further insights, I read a faith-oriented, Jesus-centered electronically delivered devotion on the topic. The devotion writer is named Bill. Bill Woolsey to be exact. Rev. Bill Woolsey to be specific. He is President and Founder of an organization called FiveTwo Network. I met him in person a few years back. His presentation, and material, were excellent.

Bill wrote some thoughts on the topic of voice (and "tone of voice"). I used Bill's written words on the subject as one of my resent Lenten morning devotions, and I want to share his thoughts with you here:

> "Some voices hinder the written word. Others make it more attractive. Help instead of hinder.

What kind of voice are you?

Tone shapes much of what we hear. It communicates a deeper meaning than the word itself.

"No problem" can come across sincere or snarky.

Depends on the tone.

"You're forgiven" can either fly freely or have strings attached. Depends on the tone.

One of the reasons God gives us His Holy Spirit. To add color-commentary to the Bible's words.

To remove our fears of God. To remove our confusion about God.

To undo whatever false assumptions we might have about God's opinions and thoughts.

To turn our ears into His eyes.

So that we not simply hear Jesus' words but also see Jesus' life.

So that we not simply read of Jesus' sacrifice but also picture Jesus' resurrection.

So that manger and cross and tomb spring to life in our lives.

So that we take to heart the divine nuance of "You're forgiven." Forever.

Voice matters. God's voice is silkysmooth for you.

[Let's do our best to] return the favor to your friends and family.

You'll make God's story even more interesting."

Pretty good, huh? I like Bill's heart, and his articulation of our shared Gospel of Jesus. May Bill's thoughtful insights above bless you, as they have blessed me. And, yes, if you're wondering, when I met Bill in person a few years back, I liked his voice then too!

LUTHERAN SCHOLARSHIP GRANTING ORGANIZATION OF OHIO Donation Deadline Extended

Good news! It is not too late to contribute to the LSGO for 2023. Recent legislation passed that allows a taxpayer to make the contribution up until the date you file your Ohio Tax return.

If you have not already contributed for 2023 and have not yet filed your Ohio taxes, please consider doing so. Donation limits are \$750 for individuals and \$1,500 for married couples filing jointly.

You may also begin making contributions to the 2024 campaign—either in a lump sum or spread into periodic contributions between now and April 15, 2025. On behalf of Messiah Lutheran School, we wish to thank all the donors who supported the Lutheran Schoolarship Granting Organization of Ohio (LSGOO). Throughout 2023, 49 donors designated Messiah Lutheran School for their contributions. These donations help make private Lutheran education a reality for more students and families.

The LSGOO purpose is to raise scholarship dollars for students to attend Lutheran schools throughout Ohio. The LSGOO makes it possible for Ohioans to contribute funds to be allocated to Messiah Lutheran School. Donors to the LSGOO qualify to receive a non-refundable tax credit for their donation, which will be applied to their Ohio income tax liability, dollar-for-dollar, up to \$750 (or \$1,500 if married filing jointly, where each person separately donates \$750 or more).

Donations to the LSGOO on behalf of Messiah Lutheran School are accepted year-round. If you are looking at your tax planning for 2024, this may be a valuable resource for you. Please visit the website <u>www.clhsa.org/</u> <u>LSGO</u> for more information and to donate.

Frequently Asked Question: How is LSGO of Ohio different from other scholarships offered by the school?

Answer: Various scholarships and/or tuition assistance may be available, including merit/need based scholarships and state programs such as EdChoice Scholarship and Cleveland scholarship programs. The LSGO of Ohio adds an additional level of assistance for schools to offer families, while also qualifying donors for a state tax credit.

Questions: How do school allocate scholarship money?

Answer: Per guidelines from the State of Ohio, funds given as gifts to scholarship granting organizations must be prioritized for students from low income families.
