Lutheran Scholarship Granting Organization of Ohio Deadline Extended!

Good news! It's not too late to contribute to the LSGO for 2023. Thank you to the 49 families who have already supported this mission. Recent legislation passed that allows a taxpayer to make the contribution up until the date you file your Ohio Tax return or the return due date.



If you have not already contributed for 2023 and have not yet filed your Ohio taxes, please consider doing so. Donation limits are \$750 for individuals and \$1,500 for married couples filing jointly.

The LSGOO purpose is to raise scholarship dollars for students to attend Lutheran schools throughout Ohio. That LSGOO makes it possible for Ohioans to contribute funds to be allocated to Messiah Lutheran School. Donors qualify to receive a non-refundable tax credit for their donation, which will be applied to their Ohio income tax liability, up to \$750 (or \$1,500 if married filing jointly).

Donation to the LSGOO on behalf of Messiah Lutheran School are accepted year-round. Please visit www.clhsa.org/LSGO for more information and to donate.

Frequently Asked Question: I do not have school age children. Can I still participate in and benefit from this program?

Answer: Yes you can! Donations from any Ohio taxpayer will be beneficial to the donor as long as you owe income tax to the state.

Answer: Absolutely! As long as the school(s) are a participant with LSGO of Ohio (Messiah is), you can designate your gift to one or more schools. The funds will be placed into an account for distributions as scholarships to families at the school(s) you select.
