Thank you to a small team of brewers that included Steve and Debbie Schneider, William Baker, and David Kucera. They brewed a batch of beer in celebration of Reformation Weekend this year. This team has brewed two other batches for Messiah. The first was in the fall of 2019, for the 90th anniversary of Messiah Lutheran, this small team met at a local Brew Kettle and made a special batch of beer. The second edition was crafted and distributed in 2021. We hope you enjoyed the hard work of the brewers this year.

COUNCIL CONNECTION—MESSIAH'S CONSTITUTION

Messiah's current constitution was last revised and approved in December 2003. Many changes in the larger church and in such things as basic technology have necessitated a revision, in accordance with the Model Constitution for Congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA). The Model Constitution was adopted by the Constituting Convention of the ELCA and approved by the Churchwide Assembly in September 2022. **Accordingly, the church Council has reviewed our constitution and will recommend changes to the congregation for approval at a special meeting during the Education Hour starting at 9:45 am on November 5th.** To indicate your interest in attending the meeting and learning more about our new constitution, whether in-person or online RSVP at mpf.fyi/Constitution. Your cooperation is requested so that we may have a more accurate count of the number of full copies that will be needed at the meeting. In the meantime, please direct any questions to any member of the church Council.

Although we will walk through the revisions on November 5, here are examples of some of them:

- Meetings may now be held by "remote communication" and notice provided "electronically" to better reflect current technology.
- Council is recommending that the privilege of voice and vote at every regular and special meeting is extended to all *Confirmed* members, without regards to age (Chapter 8).
- Several updates have been made to the duties and responsibilities of the pastor; i.e., "Rostered Minister," including protocols for calling and terminating pastoral calls (Chapter 9).
- Terminology has been updated, such as using "Minister of Word and Sacrament" for "ordained minister" or "clergy roster."
- Responsibilities of church council, terms for council members, and limits of authorization have been updated (Chapter 12).
- Through conversation with our Call Committee, Council has recommended that the Call Committee will be comprised of *seven* voting members in the future (rather than the current six), although this will not impact our current call committee structure (Chapter 13).

We hope to see you on November 5, for this important discussion relative to Messiah's governance.

STEWARDSHIP MOMENT

For over 90 years, Messiah has been blessed with God's Great Generosity to share our faith in Christ Jesus with one another. MESSIAH LUTHERAN SCHOOL—#COMEHOMETOMESSIAH



As Admissions Coordinator for Messiah School, I connect with students and families throughout their Messiah Preschool—Grade 8 school search process. A 2023 K12 Parent Survey conducted by Niche.com **Lutheran** learned that parents with household incomes from below \$28,000 up to \$89,999 are most likely to exclusively consider public schools.

Fifty-seven percent of parents consider public schools; 36% consider religious private schools. For families who considered religious private schools, Catholic (57%), "other" Christian (36%), and Evangelical Christian (16%) schools were the most commonly considered. When it's time to make a school decision, families most commonly (32%) start their new school search six months to a year before enrolling, which is why we will host our annual Messiah School Open House on January 21, 2024 from 1-3 pm.

So how do new families find Messiah School? For the second year in a row, the Niche K12 Parent Survey found that Google search (27%), word of mouth (23%), and school search and review platforms (22%) were the top sources for families to discover the schools they considered, which makes our relationship with the team of marketing experts at the Twist Creative Inc. agency so valuable to increase awareness of our Trailblazing community. Sixty-four percent of parents consider three or more schools in their school search process. The competition is real! This year we had 80 inquiries. Seventy tours resulted in 42 new students for 2023-24, nine more students than the year before.

WHAT'S HAPPENING AT MESSIAH SCHOOL:

In living out our Christian mission, Sophia, Grade 5 at Messiah, was baptized during Wednesday Chapel in the midst of our Preschool—Grade 8 student body. What a beautiful testament of our new life as adopted children of God for our staff and students!

Do you remember the excitement of the Scholastic Book Fair when you were in school? Messiah's students and church members had the opportunity throughout the week of Oct. 9 to browse and shop through popular kids books set up in the Atrium during Literacy Awareness Month. Messiah's school librarian, Megan Grauel was stationed at the checkout. This event received \$2,265 in funds so that our students can continue to enjoy new books throughout the school year.



MLS students in Grade 5 will lead Chapel on November 15. The theme is "Crossing the Red Sea."

Our annual Chrismon Make-It-And-Take-It event will be held during the Christian Education Hour on Sunday, December 3 starting at 9:45 am in the Fellowship Hall/Lunch Room. PROJECT COMPLETE Thanks Be to God!

Thanks to the generosity of many families, Messiah Lutheran School's preschool classroom repairs are complete! What start-

ed as a disaster on Christmas Eve turned into a huge blessing for our facility.

In October, we were presented with a dollar for dollar "Challenge Grant" to finish the work. Together we "finished the race" for our unplanned Preschool room renovation.

Some fun facts about this project that began on December 24, 2022. We received our occupancy permit on August 24, rededicated the space on September 24, and received our final donation to complete the project on October 24. Plus, we welcomed 24, 4-year-old students on September 5 for the start of a new school year.

The saints of Messiah continue to be an amazing group. Thank you for walking with us on this path.

GUEST PREACHERS IN NOVEMBER

During the month of November, several guest preachers will join in the worship life of the congregation. Plan now to worship and welcome these guest preachers while hearing the Gospel Good News proclaimed by fresh voices.

November 12: Rev. Mitch Phillips will preach at both Sunday worship services. Rev. Phillips serves as Assistant to the Bishop for Leadership in the Northeastern Ohio Synod and is assisting Messiah during the pastoral call process. Prior to serving on the NEO Synod staff, Rev. Phillips served Resurrection Lutheran Church in Indianapolis, IN.

November 18: Bishop Laura Barbins will preach during the evening worship at 5:30 pm Saturday. Bishop Barbins began serving as our Bishop of the Northeast Ohio Synod on December 1, 2020. Prior to her call to the Office of Bishop, she was the pastor of Celebration Lutheran, Chardon, Ohio for 19 years, Interim Pastor of Messiah Lutheran, Fairview Park, Ohio for 1 year, and Associate Pastor for Youth at Holy Trinity, Nashville, Tennessee for 2 years. Pastor Seth will preside during the Saturday evening worship service on November 18th.

November 22: Pastor Shelley Nelson-Bridger will preach during a special 7 pm Thanksgiving Eve worship service. Pastor Nelson-Bridger serves as Executive Director for United Protestant Campus Ministries in Cleveland (UPCAM), a campus of college-aged focused ministry which serves the Tri-C Metro and Western Campuses, Cleveland State University, and Case Western Reserve University. Pastor Seth Bridger will preside during this special service.

From The Pastor— "A day in the Life" [of Messiah]

Greetings & God's Peace be with you, your house, and those whom you love –

When the Beatles recorded and released their 1967 classic song, *A Day in the Life*, the story goes that the lyrics from song on the Sgt Pepper's Lonely Hearts Club Band album were written as a partnership between the creative writing of both Lennon and McCartney. Like a goodly number of the Beatles songs, *A Day in the Life* was sublime because of the collective energy and tension not just between John and Paul, but also through the contribution and investment from the entire Fab Four team contributing their full range of heart, soul, and unique giftedness to the project.

It seems to me, Messiah recently experienced "A Day in the Life" moment ... The day of the Lord, October 15.

Let me set the stage, it was a Sunday. Three people arrived to the building early in the morning, predawn. They were the advance team, helping to prepare the space. One began to set up for Education Hour later in the morning, one turned on the organ and began to play, one flipped on some lights and quietly prepared the Altar so Communion could be served and shared with the people of God in worship. Soon, they were joined by others, each contributing to the life of the community.

The 8:30 worship service began "in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit." We know these words as the Invocation. These words call us into being, reminding each of us of who's name we gather and by whom we find life truly worth living. Worship flowed, voices praised, prayers were lifted up, Christ was made known.

During the Education Hour, two men sat in the Fellowship Hall, drinking coffee, connecting, chatting about their lives. Upstairs in the Library space, nine young people and two adult leaders watched a video and discussed what they heard, learning more about the meaning of being *fed and forgiven* in the moment of Holy Communion. These current fifth graders will receive the gift of the Sacrament for the first time on Reformation Sunday. Meanwhile, down in the Sunday School room, little ones read a book together and experienced the love and joy of Christ through their teacher, several parents stood outside with smiles on their faces. Simultaneously, in the Commons, even more people were together, considering the ways Christianity is embodied through music and pondering the ways music interludes throughout the life of faith. While all of this was unfolding, even more people were in the Atrium area enjoying opportunities to look and purchase books through the blessing of the Scholastic Book Fair set up for the week by our school librarian and her family.

A Day in the Life [of Messiah] played on. The 11 am worship service began, more people gathered, songs were sung, Christ

was truly present. Immediately after the 11 am worship, five people teamed up moving tables and chairs down to Messiah's gym so that the afternoon's planned Trunk-Or-Treat community event could be moved indoors due to unfavorable weather. While this was happening, across the street in the Messiah's Middle School, the Confirmation class convened and young people along with their parents read scripture together from the Old Testament Book of Ruth, learning how God's people have often had to move, relocate, sometimes been displaced, and need of the care of others.

Back in Messiah's gym, the atmosphere was coming alive, Trunk-Or-Treat stations adapted and readied to receive and welcome a whole host of excited little ones dressed as princesses, goblins, action figures, and more dinosaurs than you ever could imagine! 154 children, plus their families, came through the gym, took pictures in the special photo booth, and enjoyed the event.

Two particular highlights from Trunk-Or-Treat: one of our neighbors from 214 St. set up a fabulous station, Harry Potter themed, who wanted to participate after seeing a yard sign for the event, and a family of six who heard about Trunk-Or-Treat through the Laundry Love outreach and accepted the invitation to attend! Thanks to everyone who contributed to making the Trunk-Or-Treat event such a hit!

A Day in the Life. Indeed!

It takes many hands [hearts and souls!] to make Messiah the beloved community it is. Each contributing, investing time and energy, and offering their unique giftedness to the project, the enterprise, the community and most especially, to God! Here at Messiah, everyone is invited to share their God-given giftedness. Thanks be to God for all who play a role in the life of Messiah.







LET THE OPPRESSED FREE

An artistic response to the issue of human trafficking

ABOUT THE SCULPTURE:

Let the Oppressed Go Free is a bronze sculpture created by world renowned artist, Timothy Schmalz, that depicts human trafficking slaves being released from captivity in order to bring attention to this societal issue. The sculpture contain 50 figures representing the different faces of human trafficking including sex exploitation, forced labor, debt bondage and more. Men, women, and children can become victims of human trafficking, particularly those vulnerable communities.

The artist found inspiration from Isaiah 58:6 where scripture talks about 'setting free the oppressed.' The sculpture depicts Saint Josephine Bakhita opening up the underground and releasing modern-day slaves. It purposefully includes figures that span history to demonstrate that human trafficking has been a societal issue for generations. The artwork also showcases males and females, many races and all ages. It in-

cludes symbols as well as coins to represent the connection between human trafficking and money.

Schmalz commented,

"Awareness is the first weapon to fight human trafficking." He has stated that people suffering are hidden in our society and his intention is to bring awareness to this tragedy that exists in every county across the world. "This sculpture is going to be an inconvenience," Schmalz declared. "Human trafficking is a problem in our society that is often invisible."



SCULPTURE VISITS CLEVELAND:

The Let the Oppressed Go Free sculpture is traveling the United States before it is permanently installed at Catholic University of America in Washington D.C. Community West Foundation and the Collaborative to End Human Trafficking of Cleveland brought the artwork to the Cleveland for display on the north side of Public Square from September 27—March 31 for free public viewing.

The only other copy of this sculpture is installed in Schio, Italy and the artist has no plans to replicate it further.
