The Holy Gospel according to Luke, the 19th chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.** 

After (Jesus) had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem. When he had come near Bethaphage and Bethany, at the place called the Mount of Olives, he sent two of the disciples, saying, "Go into the village ahead of you, and as you enter it you will find tied there a colt that has never been ridden. Untie it and bring it here. If anyone asks you, 'Why are you untying it? Just say this, 'The Lord needs it.' "So those who were sent departed and found it as he had told them. As they were untying the colt, its owners asked them,

"Teacher, order your disciples to stop."

He answered, "I tell you, if these were silent, the stones would shout out."

Isaiah 62:6-12



Zechariah 9:9-17

<sup>9</sup>Rejoice greatly, O daughter Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter Jerusalem! Lo, your king comes to you; triumphant and victorious is he, humble and riding on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey. <sup>10</sup>He will cut off the chariot from Ephraim and the war-horse from Jerusalem; and the battle bow shall be cut off, and he shall command peace to the nations; his dominion shall be from sea to sea, and from the River to the ends of the earth. <sup>11</sup>As for you also, because of the blood of my covenant with you, I will set your prisoners free from the waterless pit. <sup>12</sup>Return to your stronghold, O prisoners of hope; today I declare that I will restore to you double. <sup>13</sup>For I have bent Judah as my bow; I have made Ephraim its arrow. 



Gathered into one by the Holy Spirit, let us pray as Jesus taught us:


Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.


For people the world over who are living in the midst of war and its tumult. That all may strive for peace and reconciliation. That all may ask; What will you have me do, Lord?
